This form will help the Council determine whether this property should be exempt from Council Tax. It will also assist the Council in determining from when, or up to, which date the exemption should apply.
Halls of residence for students are exempt provided the accomodation is owned or managed by a prescribed educational establishment or by a body established for charitable purposes only, or is subject to an agreement which enables an educational establishment to nominate the majority of the student residents. The accomodation must be provided predominantly for students, but does not prevent part being used to accomodate staff or other persons. Accomodation for traditional student nurses is not exempt but if student accomodation is provided solely for nurses in full time education such premises may qualify as a hall of residence. Students taking a nursing course at a university or other institute of higher education are treated as academic students.
