Active Travel (Wales) Act 2013 Reporting Duties

In accordance with the duties under sections 7 (3) and 10 (2) of the Active Travel (Wales) Act 2013, please find Denbighshire County Council's annual report for the year 2022-23.

The actions taken to promote active travel journeys	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Level 1 and Level 2 Bikeability training – 725 children participated from 36 Denbighshire schools.
The actions taken to secure new active travel routes and related facilities and improvements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Denbighshire County Council utilised Core Active Travel fund to introduced improved active travel routes (widened footways/raised junction tables/dropped kerbs) in the Myddleton Avenue, Maes y Goron and Maes Y Dre areas of Denbigh linking to the previously completed works at nearby Ysgol Pendref. We also utilised Core ATF to enhance the existing active travel provision on Maes Y Gog in Rhyl and to introduce cycle storage facilities at a number of locations across Denbighshire.
